



Randal Garrett Scholarship Application

The Randal Garrett Scholarship is a full scholarship For Emergency Medical Technician, Firefighter I and Firefighter II courses being offered by the Midway Fire District.

The Emergency Medical Technician Basic Course has been approved by the Florida Department of Health and Florida Bureau of EMS. Midway Fire District has been licensed to teach by the Florida Department of Education.

This scholarship will be awarded to a High School senior who meets the following criteria:

1. Must be eighteen years of age upon completion of class.
2. Must have maintained 2.0 GPA.
3. Must pass necessary physical and background checks required by the State of Florida Fire Marshall's Office.
4. Must complete a Randal Garrett Scholarship application in its entirety and submit it to the Guidance Center at your school no later than April 3, 2009. **APPLICATIONS THAT ARE TURNED IN INCOMPLETE OR AFTER THE DEADLINE WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.**

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Physical Ability Test (PAT)

The means of measuring the physical ability of students will be a slight modification of the testing procedure known as the “combat challenge” – or as we refer to, the Fire Fighter Ability Test (FFAT). The events and criteria for the FFAT will be explained in class.

Each student will participate in the PAT during the first week of class so as to establish a base line as well as to exhibit their ability to do the work of a firefighter. Those persons below the normal level of ability will be counseled and referred to appropriate sources of out of class training so as to increase their performance.

The PAT will be conducted a 2nd time midway through, and a 3rd the last week of the course in order to measure the improvement in the performance of every student. All students will be required to pass the PAT through guidelines established at the beginning of class. Any student who does not pass the PAT under the preset guidelines will receive an incomplete for the course and will not be allowed to participate in the State exam. The Student shall retake the Test upon the next Academy class. The PAT is as follows:
